






Remote learning is going well so far.






My Zoom-in students have the resources needed to be successful in a remote environment.






My Zoom-in students have opportunities to share/talk in class.






I am able to assess Zoom-in students' learning.






I am able to provide Zoom-in students with feedback about learning.






How challenging are the following aspects of remote learning? Audio/visual issues with Zoom










How challenging are the following aspects of remote learning? Communicating with Zoom-in students during class






How challenging are the following aspects of remote learning? Communicating with Zoom-in students outside of class





Using assignments/assessments to check for student understanding for Zoom-in students






How challenging are the following aspects of remote learning? Using assignments/assessments to assign student grades for Zoom-in students






How challenging are the following aspects of remote learning? Recording attendance of Zoom-in students
