Characters: Narrator, Heather, Ryan, Vic, Stacy, Mr. Magoo

Narrator: The scene is set in Room 320, one of the computer lab's at Schoo Middle School. We see Heather, Ryan, Vic and Stacy sitting at their assigned computers getting ready to listen to directions from Mr. Magoo.
